At that time he had come to the train dragging his polio-ravaged less by propelling himself

with his hands on the ground. Thanks to the treatment given by Dr Jain, he was able to stand up and walk upright. Katre said "Thanks to you, I now own this shop. I am married and have a child."

Katte led Dr Jain to his village home where to Dr Jain's surprise he saw a photograph of himself, in a newspaper clipping, ensconced and anciened in Katre's Paia (prayer) room - one of the many pictures of Gods and Goddesses that were deemed
